Vatican Pushes For Sunday Legislation

In Europe, the Sunday Law issue is expected to be contentious as Pope John Paul II continues to press for mandatory Sunday-closing laws. Church & State, May, 1992.

Clearly, the Vatican is making the "civil authorities" to cooperate with the Church in the legislation of Sunday as the nation's day of rest.

"The civil authorities should be urged to cooperate with the church in maintaining and strengthening this public worship of God, and to support with their own authority the regulations set down by the church's pastors. For it is only in this way that the faithful will understand why it is Sunday and not the Sabbath day that we must keep holy." *Rome's Guardians* (1983), emphasis supplied.

Vatican Admits Sunday is NOT the Biblical Sabbath



In a recent Catholic church newsletter, it stated, "Perhaps the boldest thing the most revolutionary change the Church ever did, happened in the first century. Instead it happened in the fourth century! The holy day, the Sabbath, was changed from Saturday to Sunday. The Day of the Lord [Dies Domini] was chosen, not from any direction noted in the Scriptures, but from the Church's sense of its own power... People who think that the Scriptures should be the sole authority, should logically become [Sabbath-day] Adventists, and keep Sunday holy." *Saint Catherine Catholic Church Newsletter*, Albion, Michigan, May 21, 1985.

Rome's Challenge to Protestants: "Why Don't You Keep Holy the Sabbath Day?"

I am going to propose a very plain and serious question to those who follow the Bible and the Bible only: to give their most earnest attention. It is this: Why do you not keep holy the Sabbath Day?

"The command of Almighty God stands clearly written in the Bible in these words: 'Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six days shall thou labor, and do all thy work, but the seventh day is the Sabbath of the Lord thy God: in it thou shalt not do any work.' Exodus 20:8-10.

"You will answer me, perhaps, that you do keep the Sabbath, for that you abstain from all worldly business and diligently go to church, and say your prayers, and read your Bible at home every Sunday of your lives.

"But Sunday is not the Sabbath day. Sunday is the first day of the week, the Sabbath day is the seventh day of the week. Almighty God did not give a commandment that men should keep holy one day in seven, but He named His own day, and said distinctly: 'Thou shalt keep holy the seventh day'... and He commanded a reason for choosing this day rather than any other—a reason which belongs only to the se-

has been changed to Sunday. 'Whose? His by whom? Who has authority to change an express commandment of Almighty God? Whom God has spoken and said. Thus, it-6, keep holy the seventh day, who shall dare say, 'No, thou shalt not work and do all manner of worldly business on the seventh day but thou shalt keep holy the first day of it instead?' This is a most important question, which I know not how you answer.

"You are a Protestant, and you profess to go by the Bible and the Bible only, and yet, is so important a matter as the observance of one day in seven as the basis of your religion, you go against the plain letter of the Bible, and put another day in the place of that day which the Bible has commanded. The command to keep holy the seventh day is one of the Ten Commandments; you believe that the other nine are still binding. Who gave you authority to transfer with the fourth? If you are consistent with your own principles, if you really follow the Bible, and the Bible only you ought to be able to produce some portion of the New Testament in which this fourth commandment is expressly altered."

DATELINE SUNDAY LAW NEWSBRIEF

A recent news article that appeared in the Detroit News on July 7, 1998, announced the pope's strong call for Sunday legislation. The Pope was quoted as saying that a violator should be "punished as a heretic." The following are excerpts from that article.

"In a day when conquirer moderns are never fast enough and no one seems to have enough time for a full night's rest, Pope John Paul II is issuing a stern warning to Catholics that they should set aside Sunday for worship—and errands or their free time. 'This really is an extraordinary move,' said Jay McNally, executive director of Call to Holiness, a Metro Detroit lay group that promotes traditional Catholic teachings. 'This appears to be the strongest words the pope has issued. Period.'"

"The pontiff used his weekly address Sunday from his window over St. Peter's Square to urge church members to make time to keep the Sabbath holy. And today, the Vatican is expected to issue an Apostolic letter from the pope further stressing the Third Commandment. Apostolic letters are incorporated into church rules.

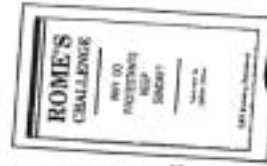
"Sundays have come to be 'felt and lived only as a weekend,' John Paul lamented Sunday. 'It (should be) the weekly day in which the church celebrates the resurrection of Christ. In obedience to the Third Commandment, Sunday must be sanctified, above all, by participation in Holy Mass.'"

"In his letter, the pope goes on to say a violator should be 'punished as a heretic,' said McNally, who read an unofficial English translation of the letter on a Vatican Web site.

"...Though the pope's letter is directed at Catholics, his concerns reach beyond the Vatican and into other religions."
